Knowledge translation: What it is and why it matters.

“Knowledge translation” is used to describe the process of actually implementing in daily medical and healthcare practice the evidence-based information that could modify clinical and public health practices, reducing both overuse and underuse of care. One difficulty is the huge amount of information produced and published. Another difficulty is the insufficient effectiveness of the numerous models, approaches and tools that have been proposed. It is crucial to find innovative and effective ways to improve the “knowledge to action cycle”.
